



Александр Николаевич Чистяков ([22 января 1914](#), [Москва](#) – [1990](#)) – [советский шахматист](#), мастер спорта СССР ([1938](#)). Пианист. Чемпион ДСО «Искусство» ([1933](#) и [1938](#)), «Учитель» ([1937](#)) и «Медик» ([1954](#)). Участник 21 чемпионата Москвы; лучшие результаты: [1936](#) – 3-5-е; [1950](#) – 1-2-е; [1956](#), [1959](#) и [1965](#) – 4-5-е места. Участник чемпионатов СССР: [1939](#) – 17-е; [1967](#) (декабрь) – 18-е места. Тренер московского городского Дворца пионеров (1950–[1976](#)). Автор ряда статей по теории о истории шахмат. Внёс вклад в теорию [французской защиты](#) (вариант Чистякова – 1.e4 e6 2.d4 d5 3.Kd2 c5 4.ed Ф:d5), [голландской защиты](#) и других начал.

Александр Николаевич ЧИСТЯКОВ (1914—1990) был первым сильным шахматистом, с которым мне довелось встретиться в сеансе одновременной игры в Парке культуры. Дело было в незапамятном году в так называемом детском городке парка — заведении, где родители оставляли своих детишек, пока сами приобщались к культуре. Не знаю, как это получалось у родителей, а детишкам было очень хорошо. Для малышей устроили павильоны с игрушками; те, что постарше, катались по небольшому пруду на лодчонках и так далее. Имелся и шахматный уголок. И вот там первокатегорник Чистяков дал сеанс на нескольких досках. А после сеанса не побрезговал разобрать партии с малолетними пижонами. Вообще он был, как я узнал позднее, удивительно деликатным человеком. Пожалуй, даже чрезмерно, по понятиям нашей суровой эпохи, вежливым. И, казалось, стеснительным.

В 1938 году Александр Николаевич стал мастером. Ему принадлежит своеобразный рекорд — он участвовал в двадцать одном чемпионате Москвы. Дважды играл в финале первенства СССР.

Стиль игры его был интересным, творческим. Он был сильным аналитиком и внес свой вклад в теорию дебютов.

По профессии, приобретенной в Консерватории, Александр Николаевич был пианистом. Нечастый случай среди шахматистов, хотя можно еще вспомнить Чеховера, Бориса Шацкеса, не говоря уж о Марке Тайманове, первом в этой группе.

Манера поведения Александра Николаевича, его музыкальное образование, творческие устремления в шахматах — все это было гармонично соединено. Он мог показаться человеком из «России, которую мы потеряли», если использовать оборот С. Говорухина — режиссера, политика и шахматиста-любителя. Однако шахматы определили поприще — Александр Николаевич работал тренером в московском Дворце пионеров.

«Знать, эпоха вещь/ серьезная/ Призадуматься велит...» — сказал поэт.
